**ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF THE BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION'S POLICIES AND PROCEDURES REGARDING CARRYING A CONCEALED WEAPON**

It is the responsibility of each retiree to meet the standards set forth in 25465 P.C. (CCW) and the Law Enforcement Officers Safety Act of 2004 (H.R. 218). At all times the following shall be applicable and in full effect.

All discharges of a firearm by a retired or separated member of the Bureau of Investigation, other than legitimate target practice or sporting activity conducted at a location where discharge of firearms is not prohibited, shall be investigated to determine if the shooting is within the law and bureau policy. The firearm(s) carried must be properly registered to the retiree in AFS if the retiree is a resident of California. The firearm(s) carried shall be recorded on the Bureau qualification roster under the retiree's name, and must be approved by the Bureau Rangemaster. Only factory ammunition shall be carried. The retired or separated member of the Bureau shall carry his/her department issued identification card whenever carrying the approved firearm(s).

Please note that any retired or separated member of the Bureau of Investigation, issued a 25465 P.C. endorsed retirement Identification Certificate and/or H.R. 218 certificate, while carrying a firearm, is PROHIBITED from:

1. Being under the influence of alcohol.
2. Being under the adverse or inhibiting influence of any over the counter or prescription medication or narcotic drug or substance.
3. Unjustifiably displaying any portion of a concealed weapon or carrying it in a manner in violation of Bureau policies.
4. Violating any law, ordinance, or municipal code; whether Federal, State, County or City.
5. Refusing to present his/her identification card, or surrender their firearm to any peace officer upon demand.
6. Impeding any peace officer in the performance of his/her duties.
7. Identifying himself/herself as a "peace officer" or a person with any peace officer powers unless that person is in fact a peace officer, as defined by the California Penal Code or Federal Statute.

In addition, any retired or separated peace officer of the Riverside County District Attorney's Office shall immediately notify the Bureau of Investigation should any of the following occur:

1. If you are arrested, detained, or you become aware that you are a subject of any criminal investigation.
2. If you are involved in the drawing, displaying or discharge of a firearm other than legitimate

target practice or sporting activity conducted at a location where display and/or discharge of firearms is not prohibited.

3. If you are served with, or are the subject of an injunction or temporary restraining order. (In some cases relating to domestic violence restraining orders or convictions, it is illegal to possess any firearm).
4. If you have a permanent change of address.

Any violation of the above restrictions may result in a review board, and may further result in the suspension or revocation of the 25465 P.C. endorsement on your Identification Certificate.

Retirees are cautioned that individual states may enact local regulations that permit private persons or entities to prohibit or restrict the possession of concealed firearms on their property, or that prohibit or restrict the possession of firearms on any state or local government property, installation, building, base or park. Federal authority may not shield you from arrest and prosecution in such locally restricted areas.

Retirees are further cautioned that firearms laws vary greatly from state to state (e.g. magazine capacity limits in various states including New York and a prohibition on carrying hollow-point ammunition in New Jersey). H.R. 218 provides for CCW privileges but does not offer immunity from the law. Familiarize yourself with federal, state and local regulations prior to interstate travel with your firearm.

**I have read and understand the information in this document. I certify that I will abide by all the policies, procedures and restrictions of the Bureau of Investigation. I grant permission to the Riverside County District Attorney's Office, Bureau of Investigation to check my background through the CLETS for any prohibitive information. I also grant permission to the Bureau of Investigation to check my background through any local law enforcement agency if I reside out of the county or out of the state. Finally, I understand and acknowledge that the Riverside County District Attorney's Office, Bureau of Investigation incurs no liability for my actions, and that I am responsible to meet all guidelines that the Bureau has set forth.**
