MURRIETA MAN CHARGED, ARRAIGNED FOR THE MURDER OF HIS WIFE WHO WAS AN ESCONDIDO POLICE OFFICER

MURRIETA – The Riverside County District Attorney's Office filed a murder charge today against a Murrieta man accused of killing his wife, who was an Escondido police officer.

Freddy Perez-Rodas, DOB: 10-14-86, is charged with one count each of murder and arson, and there also is a sentencing enhancement of personal use of a firearm. If convicted as currently charged, he could face up to 50 years to life in prison.

Perez-Rodas appeared before Judge Judith Clark for his arraignment and entered not guilty pleas to all counts. He remains in custody in lieu of \$2 million bail. The judge scheduled the next court date in this case, a felony settlement conference, for 8:30 a.m., Aug. 15, 2014, in Dept. S204 at the Southwest Justice Center.

Perez-Rodas is charged with the murder of his wife, Laura Perez, 25. Based on the evidence found during the investigation by the Murrieta Police Department, it is believed that Laura Perez was shot to death in the couple's home on Grand Oaks Court in Murrieta on July 23, 2014.

The defendant is accused of then removing the victim's body from the home and taking the body to a storage locker in Moreno Valley. Perez-Rodas then is believed to have returned to the home where he started multiple fires inside. He then called 911 to report his residence was on fire.

The case, SWF1401915, is being prosecuted by Deputy District Attorney Burke Strunsky of the DA's Homicide Unit.
