

MARSY'S LAW

California Victims' Bill of Rights California Constitution, Article 1, Section 28(b)

The California Constitution confers certain rights to victims of crime. **These rights include:**

- · Fairness and respect
- Protection from the defendent
- Safety considerations in setting bail and release conditions
- The prevention of disclosure of confidential information
- · Refusal to be interviewed by the defense
- Conference with prosecution and notice of pretrial disposition
- Notice of and presence at public proceedings
- Appearance at court proceedings and expression of views
- Speedy trial and prompt conclusion of the case
- Provide information and recommendations to probation
- · Receipt of pre-sentence report
- Conviction, sentence, incarceration, release, and escape information
- Restitution
- · Prompt return of property
- Notice of parole procedures and release on parole
- Safety of the victim and public as factors in parole release
- · Notice of these rights

HOW WE HELP VICTIMS OF CRIME

Victim Services is a division of the Riverside County District Attorney's Office designated to ensure that victims are informed and supported throughout the criminal justice process.

Victim Services Specialists work closely with prosecutors and are specially trained and educated to help many people including, but not limited to children, elders, disabled persons, violent crime victims, survivors, and witnesses. The Division of Victim Services exists to provide assistance throughout the court process and help you access to resources and referrals.

At some point in the next few months, or even as soon as the next few days, you may experience one or more of the following symptoms.

THESE ARE NORMAL REACTIONS TO STRESS FOLLOWING A TRAUMATIC EVENT

The key to managing stress in your situation is to recognize these common symptoms and **seek help** when needed.

PHYSICAL

Change in Appetite
Digestive Problems
Over- or Underactive
Fatigue / Exhaustion
Sleep Disturbance
Insomnia
Nightmares
Headaches
Nausea
Physical Difficulties

COGNITIVE

Lacking concentration
Indecisiveness
Memory disturbances
Poor problem-solving
Change in alertness
Forgetfulness
Flashbacks
Confusion
Lacking trust

EMOTIONAL

Emotional numbness
Over-sensitivity
Hopelessness
Depression
Frustration
Irratibility
Anxiety
Anger
Guilt
Fear

BEHAVIORAL

Change in activity
Communication changes
Easily / Overly startled
Emotional outbursts
Difficulty sitting still
Sexual behavior changes
Hyper-alertness
Suspiciousness
Withdrawal
